This was, therefore, a good opportunity to listen and observe the people around the table, and it was fascinating.

I noticed those who contributed too much and too little. I observed the unspoken communication, the little looks, shrugs, smiles or smirks that said so much. I picked up on the undercurrents that were suppressed, but bubbled through every now and then.

Next Sunday during our morning service we are having our Annual Parochial Church Meeting. This is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate all that God is doing in and through the life of St. Peter's as we seek to develop a community of faith, hope and opeace in the heart of the City.

Let this be an occasion when we are quick to listen and slow to speak, let it be a time when we all listen carefully and well, and let us keep in mind the words of Steven Covey, author of books on leadership, who says, 'First seek to understand; then seek to be understood.'

There will also be a meeting on May 15<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm at St. Thomas' Church, Brampton with the Archbishops' Appointments' Secretary for this appointment, Mr. Brad Cook, the Prime Minister's Appointments' Secretary, Mr. Edward Chaplin, as well as Christopher Cunliffe and Nadine Waldron.
