Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. In this time of uncertainty, we declare: Jesus is Lord!

Harvest: Food, Faith and Fragility

On Sunday we will be celebrating Harvest, both at the 10.15 Communion in church and during the 11am Zoom service (which this week will also be a communion). As with so many things, we can't hold our usual harvest celebration where we bring tins and packets of food to be distributed to those in need through the food bank at Derby City Mission. Yet the level of need is even greater this year than ever as many people are facing job losses and financial insecurity. Please do support the food bank if you possibly can, either by dropping food into the Derby City Mission warehouse, or by making a financial donation (see the next page for more details).

This year our celebration of harvest coincides with the Jewish Harvest Festival of Tabernacles (Sukkōt), which starts on Friday evening (2nd October) and lasts for a week. It has a double focus – marking, as we do, the ingathering of the harvest, but also remembering God's provision in the fragility of exodus. The tabernacle (sukkah) is a small fragile structure often made from branches and leaves, that evokes both the temporary dwellings built by farmers in the fields during harvest, and the tents in which the people lived on their forty year journey through the desert to the promised land. During the festival many Jews build a tabernacle in their garden, and spend time in it (sometimes sleeping there) to reflect on the importance of these connected themes - remembering that in fragility, both of journey and growth, we are called to deeper dependence on God.

Harvest is a time of year when we give thanks for what we have, and when we give to those less fortunate than us. For many of us, however, we give from a place of relative security, with a place to call home, a roof over our heads, insurance policies in case of crisis, and food on the table. That's a very different place to the one that the people of Israel found themselves in as they travelled in the desert, pitching a tent each night, utterly dependent on God for the provision of manna to feed them day by day, conscious of their fragility and need.

Perhaps this year, as we celebrate harvest and the food we enjoy, we might be inspired by the festival of Tabernacles to reflect more deeply on our own dependence on God, so often masked by abundance of possessions, but increasingly exposed by the insecurity of Covid19 – and to trust that the God who provided the Israelites with all they needed in the wilderness in the God who continues to feed and sustain us now.

It's Harvest Time!


