Caring for Creation: Prayer and Action

There is much in the news at the moment about COP26 – the upcoming round of climate talks taking place in Glasgow, billed as the most important climate talks since the Paris Agreement was signed in 2015. A Rocha UK, a Christian charity working with Christian communities to safeguard creation in the face of climate change writes:

Much is at stake at this conference, and it has been described as the last best chance to avoid global climate catastrophe. Hosting and chairing it is a unique responsibility for the British government. It also presents a unique opportunity for British Christians and churches to understand the key issues better and act on them, in service of our creator God, nature and all people.

Understanding the key issues, <u>and</u> acting upon them. Both of those are vital if we are to play our part as Christians, tasked with stewarding the resources the God has entrusted to us, and protecting the integrity of creation. We hope to focus on this in the coming months as a church community as we undertake an audit of our environmental impact and look at ways that we can be more environmentally responsible and aware. More information about that coming soon - watch this space!

In the meanwhile, as preparations get underway for COP26 and as we celebrate harvest on 3rd October, we are called to be praying for creation and for the many peoples in our world whose lives have been devastated by the impact of global warming. This is not an optional extra for those who are interested in environmental issues, but a core part of our vocation as Christians. A Rocha UK writes:

In the Jewish tradition, prayer is like that already. The ladder Jacob saw in his dream – with angels of God 'going up and coming down on it' – is a symbol of prayer, connecting earth and heaven. The Hebrew word for prayer is not 'levakesh – to request', but 'tefilla – to connect'. So in the Jewish mindset, the essence of prayer is about linking creator and creation.

The early church of Britain and Ireland would be puzzled with our modern- day quest to become 'eco-friendly' in our prayers. In their minds, considering creation was not a separate issue. To talk of 'the environment' as an isolated concept would have been strange. Everything was connected in Christ. Creation itself had a 'blessedness' about it.

As we celebrate harvest and give thanks for the earth, may we rediscover that blessedness and connectedness afresh, and be inspired to act upon it.

Praying for the Persecuted Church: Egypt

There are around 16.3 million Christians in Egypt, comprising almost 16 per cent of the country's population. The majority religion is Islam.

Persecution against Christians happens mostly at the community level, especially in Upper Egypt where Salafist movements exert a strong influence on the rural communities due to high levels of illiteracy and poverty.

Incidents include false accusations, community ostracism, mob violence, and the abduction of Christian women (causing many to feel unsafe leaving the house alone).

Although Egypt's government speaks positively about its Christian community, the lack of serious law enforcement and the unwillingness of local authorities to protect Christians leave them vulnerable to all kinds of attacks.

Furthermore, in contrast to how mosques and Islamic organisations are dealt with, churches and Christian non-governmental organisations are restricted in their ability to build new churches or run social services. Opposition also arises through communal hostility and mob violence.

Christians from a Muslim background often have great difficulty in living out their faith since they face enormous pressure from their families to return to Islam. The state also makes it impossible for them to get any official recognition of their conversion.
