Walking Through Holy Week

Palm Sunday is upon us, and we again begin the walk with Jesus from his entry into Jerusalem to the cross. If you haven't experienced walking through Holy Week, may I encourage it you to try it this year. There are so many ways to do it – using Bible reading notes, apps, simply reading through one of the gospels from Palm Sunday to Easter Day, or joining us for our Holy Week Services on Zoom and in church (see below for details). It can be all too easy to jump from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday without engaging fully with the journey Jesus makes in between. But walking alongside Jesus through the week opens our eyes to understand his sacrifice and suffering more deeply.

I love the poem below, based on the story of Blind Bartimaeus. And I share it at the start of this Holy Week, praying that we may "see again" the story of Jesus' walk to the cross.

I had no eyes So I sat by the roadside I had no name, Only a surname. I had no feet With no light to guide them. But I had ears And a voice to shout "Jesus Davidson, help me!" He said, "What do you want?" I saíd "To see agaín" He said, "I'm bound for Jerusalem To be scorned and tried And scourged and crucified Do you want to see all that?" I saíd, "Lord, If I stay sitting here How can I show I love you?" (Based on Mark 10: 46 - 52)

Praying for the Persecuted Church: North Korea

It's hard to know exactly how many Christians there are in North Korea, because they must keep their faith so well hidden, but Open Doors estimates it is 400,000 – some 1.5 per cent of the population. About 50-70,000 of these Christians are in horrendous prisons and labour camps.

Where believers are known to authorities for past 'crimes', like possessing a Bible, they are on the lowest rung of society and neglected for whatever meagre food aid is available. Bae* and her husband were sentenced to a lifetime of back-breaking labour after North Korean authorities discovered they owned a Bible. Every morning in the village she's forced to live in, Bae spends the day working in the fields. She has to meet her work quota of crops.. But at night, in the privacy of her home, Bae gathers with a handful of other Christians and they spend time together in worship and prayer. Bae is a secret house church leader – this is her real work.

Bae once managed to escape to China – a dangerous and risky journey – but once there, she found a safe house run by Open Doors partners. She sang worship songs and prayed loud prayers. She read the Bible openly with fellow believers, experiencing fellowship in a way that is impossible in North Korea. But amazingly, when offered the chance to stay in the safe house, she refused. Instead, Bae returned home with the food and medicine she'd been given, and a precious Bible. She shared all these with her underground group of believers. These gifts will sustain the faith of these North Korean Christians for years.
